At the insistence of all of ESP's senior consulting staff (Andrepont, Jackl, King, Ligon, Nadeau, Mangino, and Paredes), she agreed to step out front and define for SEAs the unit-level data elements that must be in a local and state record system in order to derive and report all of the EDEN elements. This is not an official document. Even better, this is an expert's advice that is timely, specific, and usable. Even with a universal disclaimer about future changes, state-specific processes, and fuzzy NCLB interpretations, this document has significant value.

ESP is limiting the distribution of this document to a select number of persons registered for a My ESP Page. We have made a tremendous resource and intellectual investment to identify the individual data elements and to produce the alignments across EDEN and the NCES handbooks. We have also created preliminary alignments with SIF objects. The EDEN/SIF charts are not being distributed at this time because SIFA will finalize the 2.0 release this summer with new objects containing many of the EDEN elements. If you are interested in a preliminary EDEN/SIF/Handbooks crosswalk, let Barbara or me know. We'll be glad to arrange a preview.

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Introduction

This document contains a list of data elements that, if included in a state's information system, provide the data needed to meet the reporting requirements of the U.S. Department of Education's Education Data Exchange Network (EDEN). EDEN collects data required for federal reports such as the Consolidated State Performance Report, Special Education reports, Safe and Drug Free Schools reports, and the NCES Common Core of Data. EDEN is still evolving, and there are discussions underway about which data groups will be considered mandatory, which data groups can be combined, and which data groups should be removed. In addition, more data groups may be added in the future. As a result, this list will need to be revised.

In putting together this EDEN list of data elements, we assume that additional data elements will be needed by the state education agency for system management and specific state reporting requirements. For instance, unique identification of individual student and staff members will be needed, so there must be data elements for ID numbers, names, and other uniquely identifying information.

The list contains data elements that are normally collected by the Office for Civil Rights in their biennial survey of school districts and schools. In addition, there are data elements about charter schools that are under consideration for inclusion in EDEN to be collected through the survey tool. These data elements should be considered "optional" for state education agencies at this time. In the EDEN site visits conducted by ESP Solutions Group staff and consultants, some SEAs indicated that they collect some of this information for their own uses. This means that the SEA would be able to provide the data for the OCR report and reduce the burden to school districts. Others, however, have not seen the need for these data elements. No SEA should consider these data elements required to be collected and reported at this time. However, these data elements are required to be maintained at the school district level.

For now, the list contains the data element name, an NCES Handbook reference number (if available), the definition, the codes needed or format for the data element, and the EDEN files in which the data element is used. The definition for each element was taken from the NCES Handbooks Online (located at http://www.nces.ed.gov/program/handbook) or the EDEN file specifications; if no definition was available; one was created to reflect the data needed for EDEN. If a data element is related to a Handbook data element, but not exactly the same, then the Handbook Number is in italics.

Some data elements have a "D" in front of them, like "Age." These data elements were derived from other data elements (Age is derived from Birthdate). A SEA may want to enter these derived data elements into their files to speed up processing. Other data elements are derived by comparing two or more data elements; however they are not included because they are less likely to be needed in a system.

Some of the student data elements are grouped by program. Thus, if a state does not have a program, the data elements in that group need not be collected. Similarly, if a school or district does not have a program, then the state education agency should not expect to receive data in that area.
